Dear Christopher,

Thank you for seeing MADALENE STRECZYNSKI for an opinion and management regarding the long term prognosis for Madalene, who experienced an adverse reaction to the covid vaccine. Madalene had the pfizer vaccine in August 2021 and developed a mid thoracic back pain approximately 1 hr later, followed by chest heaviness and breathlessness. Madalene was diagnosed with pericarditis in the November and eventually was admitted to hospital with severe breathlessness. Madalene was treated with colchicine and prednisolone. Madalene has had ongoing symptoms since that time which include tachycardia with minimal exertion (better since being on bisoprolol), episodes of chest heaviness and sharp back pains which come and go, and fatigue. These symptoms have been debilitating, and Madalene has had symptoms of feeling hopeless about this situation. Madalene has seen cardiologists in the past, and more recently Dr Davel (general physician). Madalene is hoping to also get some further advice from you regarding the management of her symptom.

Her current medications are:

Bisoprolol 2.5mg Tablet	1 Tablet In the evening.
Endep 10 10mg Tablet	½-1 In the evening (up to 3hours before bedtime).
Escitalopram 10mg/ml Oral solution	5mg Daily.
Fludrocortisone 0.1mg Tablet	½ In the morning.
Mebeverine 135mg Tablet	1 Tablet Three times a day p.r.n.
Pantoprazole 20mg Tablet	1 Tablet Daily p.r.n.
Serc 16mg Tablet	1 Tablet p.r.n.
Sumatriptan 50mg Tablet	1 Tablet Daily p.r.n. can repeat after 2 hours.
