

Please consider this as a request for progression to surgery as a matter of urgency.

Matthew Spilsbury tells me that in the course of his employment commencing on the 8th of April 2025 whilst he was participating in a rescue training mission he has had an injury that has resulted in severe right sided radiculopathy due to a disc protrusion causing significant compression of his C7 nerve root. He presents with significant weakness associated with this as well as numbness and pain that has not substantially improved. MRI scan has demonstrated a large disc protrusion causing compression of the traversing neural element.

Given his relative young age and the degree of weakness and lack of improvement it is my recommendation to consider a surgical decompression and I have proposed a C6/7 cervical disc arthroplasty with decompression as my preferred option. As his care is still a workers insurance I am requesting approval for him to proceed with surgery as early as possible as any undue delay in surgical decompression can result in permanent weakness that may not resolve.
